2. PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The Post Graduate (MD/MS) Degree Courses shall be of three years duration.

Span period: Students admitted to Post Graduate Degree Courses {Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy} should pass the degree examination within 6 years from the date of admission to the course.

Salary/Stipend in lieu of the training period will only be payable for the regular duration.

3. SEAT MATRIX

Institutions and Number of seats :

The course of Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD/MS – Ayurveda) is conducted at All India Institute of Ayurveda and A & U Tibbia College. The total number of seats available for admission to 1st year Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD/MS – Ayurveda) course for the Academic Session 2025-26 and the distribution of the seats under different categories shall be notified in due course of time after permission granted by Ministry of AYUSH on the **Delhi University** (www.admission.uod.ac.in) and Faculty of Medical Sciences (<https://fmisc.du.ac.in/>).

Distribution of seats:

50% of the total seats in Post Graduate Degree Courses as per specialty are reserved for candidates who have passed BAMS/BUMS/BHMS from the Medical Colleges (A&U and H) of the University of Delhi (Delhi University Quota) and the rest 50% of the total seats are open to all the candidates who have passed BAMS/BUMS/BHMS from the recognized Institution/University (All India Quota).

IMPORTANT POINTS

1. An eligible applicant for the session 2025-26 must familiarize with the contents of this Bulletin of Information.
2. Changes made in any Programme after the release of this Bulletin shall become effective from the date it is posted on www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmisc.du.ac.in/> ⇒ Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines
3. University reserves the right to revise, amend, update, or delete any part of this Bulletin, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations at its discretion as and when considered necessary.

4. The candidates are requested to visit the website www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmssc.du.ac.in/> \Rightarrow Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicine/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines regularly for updated information.
5. All admissions are provisional and shall be confirmed subject to verification of documents & fulfillment of the requirements for the eligibility of the candidate concerned.
6. The Counselling for allotment of seats in All India Quota will be conducted by AACCC, Govt. of India and Delhi Quota seat will be conducted by the University of Delhi.
7. It is assumed that every participating candidate of AIAPGET, 2025 Counseling has read, agreed, and accepted the Scheme and terms & conditions of the AIAPGET counseling-2025.
8. The candidate shall fill out the application form online (www.admission.uod.ac.in), preferably on their own, for PG Counseling-2025. Application submitted through any other mode shall be summarily rejected.
9. While registering on the Admission portal of the University, all candidates are advised to use the same mobile number/e-mail ID they submitted during registration for the AIAPGET, 2025 examination.
10. The candidate should ensure that all the information filled in during the online registration/application form is correct and factual. The University of Delhi shall not entertain, under any circumstances, any request to change/modify/edit/alter the information provided by the candidates.
11. Candidates can submit the PG counseling registration/application form only once. Candidates who submit more than one registration/application form shall be debarred, and further action as deemed appropriate by the University of Delhi shall be taken.
12. The Admission Authority will cancel the admission of the candidate who provided wrong information during registration and fails to produce the required original documents at the time of admission. If it is discovered at any stage that a candidate has used a false/fake/incorrect document at the time of admission, then such candidate shall be excluded from all admission processes and in case, such candidate has already been given admission, the admission shall stand cancelled.
13. The conversion of the vacant seats under Delhi Quota will be done during the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR) of counseling as per the algorithm of the University of Delhi Rules.
14. Candidate may kindly note that merely registering on the Admission Portal of the University for PG Counseling-2025 does not confer automatic rights to secure a Postgraduate [Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy] courses.
15. The admission will be terminated if the student is not regular and absent unauthorizedly/without prior permission.
16. Inter University Migration in Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy courses under the Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines and Faculty of Homoeopathy Medicines is not allowed under any circumstances.
17. The selected candidates for admission to Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD (Hom.) course may be admitted provisionally subject to submission of Medical fitness certificate (**Annexure V**) and verification of documents.
18. The student should certify whether he/she belongs to OBC/SC/ST/PwBD/EWS Category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at their website of the admission (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backward-classes/index.html>).

Self-attested copy of Non-creamy layer certificate of the current financial year (i.e. issued after 01/04/2025) and OBC caste certificate as per the Central list for OBC's shall be required at the time of registration.

19. All the candidates are required to produce their original certificates at the time of depositing fee which will be kept in the office of the concerned college and will not be returned back in any case till the completion of course.
20. Closure of admissions as per directions received from Ministry of AYUSH.
21. In case the information furnished or certificates etc. submitted are found to be false, or the candidate is found to have withheld or concealed information in his/her Application form his/her name shall be removed from the college rolls and fees deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
22. Once application form is submitted no alteration will be allowed thereafter.
23. The candidates before filling in the form shall satisfy his/her eligibility. The candidate is required to go through the Bulletin of Information carefully and acquaint himself/herself with all requirements with regard to the filling of the Application Form.
24. Application Form should be filled in by the candidate in English.
25. Incomplete Application form for Admission to Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD (Hom.) Courses will summarily be rejected.
26. Candidates appearing in rounds of counseling and offered admission in such Round must carry their original certificates in person and they will have No Right to surrender their seats once accepted and NO extension of time for joining will be granted.
27. The open merit list for the unreserved category seats will comprise of all the candidates in the order of merit including SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates if they come in the general merit. The SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidate who figures in the general merit list is entitled to be considered for admission under the unreserved category. Admission to open category seats will be strictly in the order of merit without excluding SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates.
28. This Bulletin contains only brief extracts of the ordinances, rules and regulations of the University. The candidates should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University, the NCISM and NCH regarding eligibility requirements, payment of fees, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to their respective courses.
29. The candidates should seek the information with regard to the payment of stipend, hostel and other facilities from the concerned College/Hospital/ Institution.
30. The various terms and conditions mentioned in the Bulletin of Information are subject to the changes made in the ordinances, rules, and regulations by the University from time to time as per the decision of the Academic Council/ Executive Council and also binding regulations/ directions of the National Commission for Homoeopathy/NCISM. The University reserves the right to amend the ordinances, rules and regulations at its discretion as and when considered necessary.
31. The candidature for the Post Graduate Degree Courses is strictly provisional and merely the appearance at the (AIAPGET-2025) and registering online in University of Delhi will not entitle the candidate for admission, which will be subjected to the candidate's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. Those candidates who are not eligible would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission, if at a later stage it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules.
32. Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course, he/she shall be liable to criminal prosecution; it will entail disqualification and shall render the

candidate unfit for admission without any notice. The candidate shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the University.

33. The candidates shall comply with all the instructions while filling in the registration form for submission of admission fee on fee portal of the University.
34. The candidate who is already pursuing any other Course must resign / relinquish the seat before completing the admission process but not later than 03 working days from the date of allotment of seat in the Delhi University Quota & All India Quota Counselling.
35. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Joint Admission Committee/Homoeopathic Medical Courses Admission Committee shall be final.
36. The in-service candidates shall upload/submit No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their employer to the effect that they have no objection and the candidate will be relieved/ granted study leave for pursuing the course.
37. After declaration of result of AIAPGET-2025, a candidate who is in-service and who is likely to get admission, should initiate the process of obtaining Study Leave/ getting relieved so that he/ she is able to join the course concerned by the stipulated date.
38. No candidate shall be allowed to join a course unless he/she has been relieved/ sanctioned study leave from his/ her employer.
39. The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination by a duly constituted medical board at the assigned institution at their own cost on the specified date. A candidate found medically unfit for the course will not be allowed to join the course and his/her admission would be cancelled.
40. It is mandatory for a candidate admitted to any course to get himself/ herself registered with the National Commission for Indian System for Medicine/ National Commission for Homoeopathy within three months of joining the course, failing which his/ her admission shall be cancelled.
41. The Joint Admission Committee/Homoeopathic Medical Courses Admission Committee reserves the right not to admit any candidate in a course(s).
42. For all the legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.
43. The candidates must attend the Counselling on the stipulated date and time to be notified on website www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmnc.du.ac.in/> in due course of time.
44. Candidates should preserve their Admission Ticket (AIAPGET-2025) till the completion of admission process and produce the same during counselling and at the time of joining the course.
45. M.D. (Homoeopathy): - There shall be minimum of 75% attendance to become eligible for appearing M.D.(Homoeopathy) part-I and Part-II Examination.
46. MD/MS (Ayurveda & Unani): The Student shall have to attend minimum 80% of the total lectures, practical and clinical tutorials or classes to become eligible for appearing in the examination.
47. The student shall submit himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice- Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Act, the Ordinance and the Rules that have been framed by the University from time to time.
48. The Student would undergo the course on full-time basis, no private practice, part-time job being permissible during the duration of the course.

49. University can remove the name of the student from the rolls in case his/her work or conduct is reported to be not satisfactory by the Supervisor/Head of the Department/Head of the Institution.
50. The admission will be terminated if the student is not regular and absent unauthorized/without prior permission.

ADMISSION PROCESS

ONLINE REGISTRATION FOR COUNSELLING: The candidates are required to register themselves online on <https://aacc.gov.in> of the Ministry of AYUSH (Government of India) to participate in Counselling of PG (MD/MS) Courses-2025 for **50% All India Quota**.

Only those candidates who are allotted seats in colleges affiliated to University of Delhi, after successful allotment of seats by the AACCC under 50% AIQ are required to register themselves on the online admission portal on the official websites of the University website i.e. www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmisc.du.ac.in/>

(a) **Admissions by UoD for 50% Delhi University Quota:**

Candidates are advised to visit the Faculty website www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmisc.du.ac.in/> in the relevant section i.e. MD/MS Ayurveda & Unani and MD (Hom.) regularly for any update regarding conduct of counselling for academic year 2025-26 for Delhi University Quota (DUQ).

The candidates are required to register themselves online on <https://fmisc.du.ac.in/> to participate in Counselling of PG (MD/MS) Courses-2025 for 50% Delhi University Quota (DUQ).

1. Before initiating the registration for admission, the candidates are advised to refer to PG (MD/MS – A&U and MD –Hom.) Courses Bulletin of Information 2025 thoroughly.
 2. If any candidate, who has not been allotted any seat in University of Delhi or otherwise ineligible to register for admission, somehow register himself/herself on the admission portal of the University, in such cases his/her registration will be treated as 'INVALID' and no fees will be refunded.
 3. Further, the candidates under the All India Quota are also required to register themselves after allotment of seats from AACCC at the online link available on www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmisc.du.ac.in/>
- (b) The candidates are required to bring Print out of Registration Form, Allotment letter alongwith original certificates and 02 sets of self-attested photocopies at the time of admission at the respective allotted college.
- (c) Once all the above – mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with “Make Payment”. Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using Back button before making payment. After payment is made no changes can be made.
- (d) Candidate’s application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fees.
- (e) Please note that the candidature is subject to the candidate’s fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study.

In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility, criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the candidate’s own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto and the fees paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The candidates are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

To apply for Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy Courses in UoD, the following are mandatorily required:

- Applicant's Name (as it appears in AIAPGET-2025)
- Date of Birth

Before starting the registration process, candidate is advised to scan and keep a copy of all the required documents/ certificates on his/her Computer/ Laptop to avoid mistakes while filling in the form.

The application form has the following sections:



Personal Section

In the Personal Section, the details entered by the candidate must match with the particulars mentioned in the certificates/ documents of the candidate. Mismatches/ discrepancies may lead to the rejection of the application at any stage.

Candidate must fill the Personal Section carefully.

The candidate who had opted for PwBD category in AIAPGET -2025 will not be allowed to change his/her category as s(he) would have availed PwBD benefits (such as compensatory time and/or provision of scribe) during AIAPGET -2025.

Candidate opting for CW category must choose the CW Priority carefully.

Candidate must ensure that the Bank Account details filled in by him/her are valid and belong either to the candidate or his/her immediate family members only. It may be noted that refunds (if any) by UoD, will be made only to this account. Change of Bank Account details is not allowed under any circumstances during the entire admission process. It will be mandatory to submit the PAN Card details of the person whose bank details are mentioned in the application form.

Once the form is submitted, the following Personal Details will not be changed:

- Parent's Name
- Category / Sub-Category/Caste/ Supernumerary Quotas
- Gender
- Email id
- Mobile number
- Bank Account details

Candidates must enter their own AIAPGET -2025 Registration No., AIR Rank and Score carefully. Any discrepancy in the declaration of AIAPGET -2025 Registration No., AIR Rank and Score will lead to cancellation of admission, if allocated.

Academic Section

In order to be eligible for admission to post-graduate courses for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the 'All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET)' held for the said academic year:

Provided that in respect of-

- (a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile;
- (b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

Uploads

The candidate must upload the required relevant documents.

The name of the candidate claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/CW/PwBD must match with the name that appears on the corresponding School Board qualifying certificates and in AIAPGET-2025. Similarly, the parents' names must match the certificates.

The candidate shall be responsible for the legibility and authenticity of the certificate s(he) uploads. S(he) must take utmost care to ensure that uploaded documents/ certificates are authentic and accurate.

If any false attestation/falsified records are detected, the Candidate will be debarred from the University and penal action will be taken against the Candidate. No fees will be refunded in such cases.

No undertaking in lieu of incomplete/ non-availability of certificates/ documents will be accepted.

ADVICE

Candidates must ensure that the uploaded certificates are visible and readable.

Preview

The candidate will be able to preview the application form only after the successful uploading of the mandatory documents.

The candidate will have the option of editing/ making changes, if required, at this stage.

The candidate must carefully read every detail entered by him/her before proceeding to the next section of the Final Submission.

No change/edit/modification will be allowed once the application form is successfully submitted.

Submission

Once the application form has been filled and the documents are uploaded, the candidate must submit the form by paying the Registration fee. A candidate will become eligible to participate further only after the successful realization of the registration fees within the stipulated time.

The fee must be paid only through the Payment Gateway link provided on the candidate's dashboard. If the registration fee is not successfully remitted, the application will not be considered for allocation under any circumstances.

Candidates are advised to use any one of these payment modes: Net Banking/ Debit Card/ Credit Card/ UPI.

ADVICE

Upon successful payment of the Registration fee, candidates are advised to keep records of the transaction details as proof for future reference.

Providing the Preferences

The candidate must enter the AIAPGET -2025 rank and score.

Candidate must give his/her preference for Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD-Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD (Hom.) Courses in which s(he) is willing to take admission, if offered.

The candidate must take utmost care while ordering the preferences. Only the preferences submitted by the candidate will be considered for allocations and upgrades (if any).

The submitted preference order will determine the allocation of seat (Refer to Clause 9 for Allocation Rules).

Before submitting, the candidate must ensure that the order of preferences is as per his/her choice. **Editing the preferences after**

the stipulated deadline will NOT be allowed, i.e., the candidate CANNOT change the order of his/her preferences OR add/delete anymore Program/s after the stipulated deadline.

Registration Fee:

(a) Registration Fee (non-refundable):-

(b) Registration fee have to be paid during online registration process through one of the available online payment options.

(c) It may be noted that the application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fee.

- Self-attested copy of certificate in support of educational qualifications: BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Degree as per requirement of the course (only PDF & size upto200KB).
- Self-attested copy of detailed marks certificate of qualifying examinations: I, II, III& Final Professional examination of BAMS/BUMS/BHMS and year-wise detailed marks certificates of Master's Degree/Bachelor's Degree, as required course –wise (only PDF & size up to 200KB).
- Self-attested copy of BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Examination attempt certificate (only PDF & size up to 200KB).
- Self-attested copy of the compulsory rotating internship certificate (only PDF & size upto200 KB).
- Self-attested copy of registration Certificate from State Council/Board of A&U Medicine/Board of Homoeopathic System/NCISM/NCH (only PDF & size upto200KB).
- Self-attested copy of Non-creamy layer certificate of the current financial year (i.e. after 01/04/2025) and OBC caste certificate as per the Central list for OBC's (only PDF & size 200 upto KB).
- Self-attested copy of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/OBC/EWS certificate, if applicable (only PDF & size upto 200KB).
- Self-attested copy of Person with Disability certificate as per the format given at Annexure-I, if applicable (only PDF & size 200KB).
- Self-attested copy of No objection certificate issued by the employer (for in service candidates) (only PDF & size upto200KB).
- Self-attested copy of Admit Card of AIAPGET- 2025(only PDF & size upto 200KB).
- Self-attested copy of Score card of AIAPGET-2025(only PDF & size upto200KB).
- Once all the above – mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with “Make Payment”. Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using Back button before making payment. After payment is made no changes can be made.

- (p) Candidate's application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fees.
- (q) Please note that the candidature is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study. **In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility, criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the candidate's own risk and cost and if at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto. And the fees paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.**

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The candidates are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

9. ALLOCATION RULES

1. The University will only consider the score obtained in AIA-PGET-2025 for the purpose of allocations.
2. The Highest Possible Preference will be provisionally allocated to a candidate considering the following criteria:
 - (i) AIR (ALL INDIA RANK)
 - (ii) Category Rank (UR/OBC-NCL/SC/ST/EWS)
 - (iii) Availability of seats
 - (iv) Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document or published on the admission website of UoD.
3. The merit list for the UR category seats will comprise of all candidates in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list for the Unreserved (UR) category will also include SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS candidates, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for the UR category. No candidate can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the Candidate belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS category. Discrimination on the basis of category/caste is completely unlawful. The UoD does not tolerate discrimination against any Candidate/student on this basis. Strict action will be taken against any violations.
4. If candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD/CW category do not have a valid certificate/ document issued by the respective issuing authority at the time of admission, they will not be considered for allocation in the relevant category as claimed. (Refer to Annexure III and V).
5. If the total number of eligible ST category candidates who have applied for a particular Program exhausts, then the remaining seats under this category for that particular Program will be allocated to eligible SC category candidates and vice-versa.
6. In case, a candidate who was allocated a seat under any reserved category/ sub-category and was rejected on the basis of deficiency/ies in the category/sub-category/ caste documents, s(he) may be considered for seat allocation in subsequent round/s (if any) in UR category as per his/her eligibility, merit and availability of seats in UR. The deficiency/ies in the requisite document do/es not include submission of forged or fake document(s). The candidature of any candidate found committing such forgery/ cheating/ misrepresentation shall be out rightly rejected.

10. SEAT ALLOCATION AND ADMISSION

Acceptance, Physical Verification of Documents and Approval

On declaration of each allocation round, if a seat is provisionally allocated, the candidate must "Accept" the allocated seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round.

Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance of the allocated seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally allocated seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent round.

Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines will verify the following:

1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate
2. AIA-PGET 2025 rank and score
3. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the candidate

After verification, the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines /Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines will either '**Approve**' or '**Reject**' the application.

For the final approval of the admission, the candidate shall have to physically get the original certificates verified at the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines /Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines within the stipulated time as and when announced by the University.

During physical verification, if any document/ certificate is found inadequate/ insufficient/ inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, *ipso facto*. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission] for the Academic Session 2025-26.

In case of Approval: Once the approval is accorded, the candidate will have to pay the requisite admission fee.

In case of Rejection: At the time approval, if an application gets rejected, any/all of the following reason/s may be stated:

1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate
2. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the Candidate
2. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines /Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines within the stipulated time

11. SUBSEQUENT ALLOCATION ROUNDS

The University may announce multiple Stray Vacancy Rounds (SVR) based on the availability of the seats that arise due to rejections, cancellations, and withdrawals. UoD will display the vacant seats on its admission website (admission.uod.ac.in) before every allocation round.

All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option in a particular round will be considered for the respective allocation round, subject to the availability of seats.

Candidates who were allocated their first preference in any round will not be considered in subsequent round/s of allocation.

12. UPGRADE & FREEZE

Upgrade

Before beginning an Allocation Round, the University will open an "Upgrade" Window for all admitted candidates. The respective candidate is required to report to the concerned college for Upgradation.

Choosing the option 'Upgrade' will mean that the candidate consents to consideration of an offer of admission to a Program of his/her higher preference in the subsequent round (if any). His/her current admitted seat will be auto-canceled if the new preference is allocated.

The Program in which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered to the candidate in any subsequent round. Similarly, the Program/s which were below in the preference order at which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent round/s.

The upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who was allocated his/her first preference.

It will be the candidate's responsibility to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. Failure/inability to participate in the upgradation process will not be considered a grievance in any circumstance.

A candidate who gets upgraded will have to 'Accept' the upgraded seat and complete the admission procedures on the upgraded allocated seat/s. If a candidate does not do any activity on the upgraded seat/s, it will, by default, be considered cancelled and the candidate will be out of the allocation process.

If a candidate is not upgraded, his/her admission to the earlier seat will be retained.

Selecting an upgrade does not mean an assurance of a seat in the next/ any subsequent allocation rounds.

Upgradation is subject to:

- a. Merit (AIR)
- b. Order of Preference
- c. Availability of seats

Freeze

A candidate who has been admitted to an allocated seat and desires to continue with it should submit a 'Freeze' request through his/her dashboard. **On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will never be allowed to opt for "Upgradation."**

If an admitted candidate neither opts for Upgrade nor Freeze and remains inactive in that round, the admission taken by him/her will be retained and s(he) will not be considered for upgradation in any subsequent round/s.

13. CANCELLATION OF PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT/ ADMISSION

1. Failure to 'Accept' the provisionally allocated seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to cancellation of the allocated seat.
2. The provisionally allocated seat will be cancelled if a candidate fails to pay the admission confirmation fees within the stipulated time.
3. The provisionally allocated seat/admission will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/ certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/ fraudulent.
4. The provisionally allocated seat/admission will be cancelled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by UoD.

A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is canceled due to any of the above-mentioned reason will forfeit the right to seek admission to UoD and no fee shall be refunded.

14. WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION BY THE CANDIDATE

A candidate who has been admitted to a Program but wishes to withdraw can do so through his/her dashboard by selecting the 'Withdraw' option and paying a withdrawal fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).

The Withdrawal option will be suspended on the announcement of the Stray Vacancy Round.

Stray Vacancy Round

After completing regular allocation rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce **Stray Vacancy Round** of admission.

Candidates who had applied earlier but are not admitted on the date of declaration of the **Stray Vacancy Round** can participate in Stray Vacancy Round.

To be considered in a Stray Vacancy Round, the candidate will have to opt for **Stray Vacancy Round** through his/her dashboard.

In SVR Admissions, allocations will be done on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Availability of seats
2. Merit
3. Order of Preference
4. Category
5. Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document (Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda

Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy), or published on the admission website of UoD

It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission to the seat allocated in a **Stray Vacancy Round**. Failure to accept the allocated seat in the **Stray Vacancy Round** will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD.

There will be no option of 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' during the **Stray Vacancy Round**.

COUNSELLING PROCESS

ROUND-1

Eligibility for participation:

Only AIA-PGET (PG)-2025 qualified candidates are eligible to apply/register for the Delhi University - PG (Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy) counseling.

Process:

Step 1: Registration for all AIA-PGET (PG) qualified candidates who wish to participate in PG (Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy) Counseling for admission to AU&H-DUQ seats under the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathy Medicines, Delhi University.

Step 2: Payment of Registration Fee (Non-Refundable Registration Fee + refundable Security Money) as per the candidate's preference on the '**selection of counseling**' in the Admission portal of the University -PG Portal i.e., Delhi University Quota under University of Delhi.

Step 3: Choice filling as per the candidate's preference on streams [Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD- Unani)/Mahire-Jarahat (MS-Unani), MD Homoeopathy] and Institute. (candidates can lock their choices as per schedule; if the candidate cannot lock the choices in time, it will automatically be locked as per server time)

Step 4: Processing of seat allotment as per candidate's merit and choices on streams & institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on portal.

Step 5: Publication of provisional result on the Admission portal of the University-PG portal: If there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to pg@faum.du.ac.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

Step 6: Publication of final Seat allotment list (final result): Candidates can download the provisional allotment letter from the <https://faumpg.uod.ac.in/index.php/site/index>.

Step 7: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute with all original documents within the stipulated time as per schedule.

Note: The registration unlocking facility schedule is available "as a one-time measure" for all candidates who have not locked their choices to edit/modify the candidate's registration details on the portal if they fill in any wrong information

ROUND-2

Eligibility for participation:

- a)** Candidates registered and participated in the 1st Round but were not allotted a seat will be eligible to participate in the Round 2nd.
- b)** R-1 not joined candidates who have opted for free exit in the 1st Round.
- c)** Candidates joined the R-1 allotted seat and submitted willingness for up-gradation at the time of reporting during R-1.
- d)** Round 1 joined candidates who availed of free exit and filled choices till the last day of choice filling period for R-2 are eligible for seat allotment. (*Free exit period for R-1 joined candidates is available till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result-excluding the final result date*)

Process:

Step 1: Processing of seat allotment as per candidate's merit and choices on streams & institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on the portal.

Step 2: Publication of provisional result on the Delhi University -PG portal; if there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to pg@faum.du.ac.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

Step 3: Publication of final Seat allotment list (final result): Candidates can download the provisional allotment letter from the Delhi University -PG portal.

Step 4: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute with all original documents within the stipulated time as per schedule.

ROUND-3

Eligibility for participation:

- a)** Candidates registered and participated in the 2nd Round but were not allotted a seat will be eligible to participate in the Round 3rd.
- b)** R-2 not joined candidates who have opted for free exit in the 2nd Round.
- c)** Candidates joined the R-2 allotted seat and submitted willingness for up-gradation at the time of reporting during R-2.
- d)** Round 2 joined candidates who availed of free exit and filled choices till the last day of choice filling period for R-3 are eligible for seat allotment. (*Free exit period for R-2 joined candidates is available till the date of announcement of the R-3 final result-excluding the final result date*)

Process:

Step 1: Processing of seat allotment as per candidate's merit and choices on streams & institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on the portal.

Step 2: Publication of provisional result on the Delhi University -PG portal; if there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to pg@faum.du.ac.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

Step 3: Publication of final Seat allotment list (final result): Candidates can download the provisional allotment letter from the Delhi University -PG portal.

Step 4: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute with all original documents within the stipulated time as per schedule.

STRAY VACANCY ROUND

- The AU & H- **Delhi University Quota** seats remain vacant (not joined/withdrawn) after the 3rd Round of UoD-PG Counseling will continue to be filled through the online **Stray Vacancy Round** conducted by the UoD.
- The reserved vacant (Delhi University Quota) seats of PwBD sub-category of AU and H will be converted during the Stray Vacancy Round as per the approved conversion algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category in Stray Vacancy Rounds.

Eligibility for participation:

- a) Candidates registered and participated in the previous rounds (1st , 2nd and 3rd) but were not allotted a seat will be eligible to participate in the Stray Vacancy Rounds.
- b) Candidates joined the R-1, 2 and 3 allotted seat and submitted willingness for up-gradation at the time of reporting.

Process:

Step 1: Processing of seat allotment as per candidate's merit and choices on streams & institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on the portal.

Step 2: Publication of provisional result on the Delhi University -PG portal; if there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to pg@faum.du.ac.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

Step 3: Publication of final Seat allotment list (final result): Candidates can download the provisional allotment letter from the Delhi University -PG portal.

Step 4: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute with all original documents within the stipulated time as per schedule.

- (ii) (a) No fees need be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post- metric Scholarships/top Class Scholarships. At the time of admission, they may be advised to deposit the fees with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the CFHEIs will be responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.

- (b) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fees in the Institute then fees may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (c) Special schemes under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHELIs, for providing other facilities like books, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under these Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.
(Circular No. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 09th /12th November, 2015 of the University enclosing letter F.No. 14-5/2013-Sc/ST dated 13th January, 2014 of MHRD, Govt. of India).
- (iii) Bond: A bond worth Rs 10.00 lacs with two sureties must be executed by the candidates at the time of their admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Bond is executed by the candidates. The proforma of Bond is available on website <https://fmssc.du.ac.in/>. The students shall have to pay the Bond money of Rs 10.00 lacs to the Institution/University in the following circumstances: -
- If a student surrenders seat in violation of NCISM/NCH rules/instructions, after joining the allotted institution.
 - If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
 - If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct /indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the student would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Bond money, as the case may be.

Note: -

- Thirty percent of the bond money thus collected will be deposited with the University (Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicine/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicine) by the institution and rest could be utilized by the institution for development of PG teaching and training programmes.
- The Candidates who have been provisionally admitted in a course shall appear before a medical board on the specified dates at the assigned institution for medical examinations.
- Any candidate who is found medically unfit may collect their original certificates etc. from the concerned College/Institution/Hospital.
- The student, who have been offered a regular post of Medical Profession under the Central/State Government/Autonomous /Statutory Body may request to the Board of Research Studies through Head of the Institution for the temporary discontinuation of the course unless he/she has discontinued the employment.

Enrolment:

- Enrolment of students who are not enrolled with the University of Delhi shall be done by Head of College/Institution concerned as per circular no. Aca-II/Circular/Enrol.No.2018/01 dated 08.01.2018 and SDC/Aca. /091/2018/9435 dated 15.01.2018 on submission of prescribed fee.
- The provisional admission of a candidate would not be valid, if the candidate does not complete the above-mentioned requirements. After complying with the above-mentioned requirements of joining the

course at the assigned institution, the joining report of the candidate is required to be submitted to the office of the Assistant Registrar, Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicine/ Faculty of Homoeopathic through the Head of the Institution concerned.

Confirmation of Admission:

- The admission of the candidate shall be provisional till it is confirmed. The Head of the Department concerned after 6 months of the commencement of the course, but not later than 9 months of the commencement of the course, shall submit through the Head of the Institution, a report to the Joint Board of Research Studies of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicine regarding performance of the candidate. If the performance is stated to be satisfactory, his/her provisional admission shall be confirmed. If the performance is not found satisfactory, the admission shall be cancelled and the candidate will be informed about this within one month of the receipt of the report from the Head of the Institution.

Post Graduate Degree Courses Training, Fees and Examination:

- The Post Graduate Degree Courses are full-time courses. No Candidate shall be allowed to apply for/to join any other course or any post or practice or consultation either in India or abroad, once he/she has been admitted in the course and till the course is completed.

The candidate should complete the course as per the norms of the Delhi University within the stipulated period. Any excess leave/period of absence has to be compensated by extension of training period. The student has to complete satisfactory training before becoming eligible for appearing in the examination.

- The Post-Graduate student has to fulfill the requirement regarding thesis before being eligible to appear in the examination. The students are required to deposit a sum of Rs. 100/- to their respective institution as thesis protocol fees and thesis evaluation fees of Rs. 15,000/- through Online mode only in the Account of Director, UDSC-Maintenance A/c, Account No. 42113431541, Branch Code-8778, IFSC Code: - SBIN0008778, Bank- State Bank of India, South Delhi Campus.

Stipend:

- The stipend will be paid to the candidates pursuing Postgraduate Degree Course as per rules of respective college/institution. Therefore, any grievance regarding payment of stipend shall be dealt with the concerned college / institution and University of Delhi will not entertain any such matters.

REMITTANCE OF FEE

Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after the successful realization of the admission confirmation fee. The admission confirmation fee must be paid only through the candidate's dashboard. If the fee is not successfully remitted within the stipulated time, the admission will not be considered complete under any circumstances.

For all payments, candidates are advised to use any of these payment modes: Net Banking/ Debit Card/ Credit Card/ UPI.

Virtual Wallet

Upon the successful remittance of the admission confirmation fee, a virtual wallet will be created for a candidate.

In case a candidate gets upgraded and the Fee of the upgraded seat is more than the amount in the virtual wallet of the candidate, s(he) will have to pay the differential amount within the stipulated time.

In case the fee of the upgraded seat is less than the amount in the virtual wallet of the candidate, it will be auto-debited upon receiving approval from the University.

Payment Failures

In the likely case of payment failure-related issues:

1. If the amount is not deducted from the account, the candidate must try paying again before the payment deadline.
2. Candidate must use a stable internet connection while making the online payment.
3. Candidate must use the correct credentials to make a successful payment.
4. If the amount is deducted, but the notification is not received, the candidate may seek confirmation from his/her source bank.
5. RESERVATION POLICIES

PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITY (PwBD)

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program is reserved for PwBD candidates.

For the format of PwBD certificate, refer to **Annexure I**. Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736(E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.

As per the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, a 'person with benchmark disability means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority'. It may be noted that the erstwhile Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (No. 1 of 1996), under which reservation for Persons with Disabilities in admissions was provided earlier, has now been repealed.

Persons with benchmark disabilities falling within any of the following specified categories of disabilities as mentioned in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 [See Clause (zc) of Section 2 of the said Act] are eligible to get the benefit of the said reservation.

A. Locomotor Disability

Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

1. **"Leprosy cured Person"** means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
 - i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;
 - ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
 - iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
2. **"Cerebral Palsy"** means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
3. **"Dwarfism"** means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
4. **"Muscular Dystrophy"** means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
5. **"Acid Attack Victims"** means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual Impairment

6. **"Blindness"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction
 - (i) Total absence of sight ; or
 - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
 - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
7. **"Low-vision"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:

- (i) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree upto 10 degree.

C. Hearing Impairment

- 8. **"Deaf"** means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 9. **"Hard of Hearing"** means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 10. **"Speech and Language Disability"** means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

D. Intellectual Disability

A condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- 11. **"Specific Learning Disabilities"** means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
- 12. **"Autism Spectrum Disorder"** means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with un usual or stereotypical rituals or behaviors.

E. Mental Illness

"Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.

F. Disability caused due to Chronic neurological conditions, such as—

- 13. **"Multiple Sclerosis"** means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
- 14. **"Parkinson's Disease"** means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

G. Blood Disorder

- 15. **"Haemophilia"** means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding.
- 16. **"Thalassemia"** means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of hemoglobin.
- 17. **"Sickle Cell Disease"** means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

H. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above-specified disabilities)

Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

I. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

CONCESSIONAL/WAIVER OF FEES IN RESPECT OF PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PwBD)

Candidates belonging to PwBD category shall be given a fee concession of 75% of the total fees as compared to the other students taking admission in a particular program of the University.

Candidates must ensure that the PwBD certificate is in the candidate's name and issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a duly attested photograph of the candidate.

As per Gazette notification dated 4.02.2019 issued by Government of India regarding Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India related to Amendment Notification for guidelines regarding admission of students with "specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 with respect to admission in BAMS/BUMS. (Appendix- J), 5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 based on the merit list of 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test'. For this purpose the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in AYUSH with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'J'. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category.

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR SCHEDULED CASTE (SC) AND SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST) CANDIDATES

22.5% of the total number of seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:

- Name of his/ her caste/tribe
- Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
- District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
- The appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his /her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/ tribe certificate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ ST certificate:

- District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- Chief Presidency Magistrate /Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates to note that the SC / ST Certificate from any other person / authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the Candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, Candidate's caste / tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule. It is a statutory obligation on the part of Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines shall not refuse admission to any SC/ST Candidate on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose, remedial classes may be arranged by the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of

Homoeopathic Medicines by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

Provided that, if any seat(s) reserved for the candidates belonging to SC and ST categories remains unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s) under that category, the same shall be filled in the following manner:

- (i) Such unfilled seat(s) will be offered to the eligible candidates of the other category i.e. seat(s) of SC category to ST category candidates or vice-versa as the case may be.
- (ii) If the seat(s) remain unfilled even after applying clause (i) above, these unfilled seats reserved for SC/ST Category, if any, will be kept vacant.

The format of Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Candidates certificate is given at Annexure – II

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES (OBC, NON-CREAMY LAYER)

27% of seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC-Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).

At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs (Govt. of India) notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward_classes/index.html.) The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93-Estt.(SCT) dated 15.11.1993).

The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and **whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only**, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt.(Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2025.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines to fill all the seats reserved for OBC Candidates.

Ragging: Ordinance XVC

- (i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honor of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (i) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (ii) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suomoto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- (iii) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- (iv) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- (v) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- (vi) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- (vii) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- (viii) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.

- (ix) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- (x) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
- (xi) The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

Sexual Harassment

Sexual Harassment (Ordinance XV-D) has repelled by the Act passed by Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013(Ref. No. Estab.II(i)/27/ACC/2006 dated 09.01.2014. (www.wed.nic.in/wcdact/womenactsex.pdf).

Note: -For all legal matters the Jurisdiction will be National Capital Territory of Delhi only.
