1. Information related to the Admission process:

The counseling for admission to Under Graduate (MBBS/BDS) Courses -2025-2026 for both quotas i.e.85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota will be undertaken by Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India).

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-**A. ONLINE REGISTRATION FOR COUNSELLING:**

The applicants are required to register themselves online on www.mcc.nic.in / Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt. of India) to participate in Counselling of UG (MBBS/BDS) courses for the Academic Year 2025-2026 for both 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota.

B. Admissions (After successful allotment of MBBS/BDS seats by MCC for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota):

- Only those applicants who are allotted seats in Colleges affiliated to University of Delhi after successful allotment of seats by the MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) are required to register themselves on the online admission portal on the official website <https://fm-sc.du.ac.in> of Faculty of Medical Sciences through online link* for admission to MBBS/BDS for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota after verification of their documents by the respective colleges. They are required to complete the registration by uploading their documents, photograph, signatures and the online payment of registration Fee.


* Online link will be provided later on the official website of Faculty of Medical Sciences i.e. <https://fm-sc.du.ac.in> under Course updates – UG (MBBS/BDS).

- Before initiating the registration for admission, the applicants are advised to refer to UG (MBBS/BDS) Bulletin of Information-2025 thoroughly.
- Any applicant, who has not been allotted any seat in University of Delhi under 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota or if otherwise ineligible to register for admission, somehow registered himself/herself on <https://fm-sc.du.ac.in>, in such cases their registration will be invalid and no refund of fee will be done under any circumstances.


C. Admission Process after successful Allotment of seats by MCC/Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India):

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- (a) All the applicants seeking admission to the Under-graduate (MBBS/BDS) Courses are required to register online on website: <https://fmsc.du.ac.in>.
- Go to home page of the website of Faculty of Medical Sciences i.e <https://fmsc.du.ac.in> → courses → undergraduate courses (MBBS/BDS) → click here for MBBS/BDS Admission → click on online link under Course updates UG (MBBS/BDS).
- (b) Online registration details for admission to the Under-graduate (MBBS/BDS) courses are as under:
- As a first time user, the applicant shall create the login details.
 - In the “Confirm your Information” webpage, applicant shall provide the NEET-UG-2025 Roll No. and Date of Birth. Clicking on “View” button will display further details of the applicant.
 - If the details are correct, applicant can click “Confirm” and proceed further.
 - On the “New Registration” page, the applicant has to enter a valid Mobile No. and Email ID which would be used for any future communication with the University for admission purpose.
 - The Applicant shall then create a password (of maximum six characters) for online registration purpose. **This password does not need to be same as applicant’s email account password, which is used to access one’s email account.**
 - Applicant shall provide a valid mobile phone number (10 digit number without any prefix).
 - Please verify that all the details given in the form are correct. This information will be used during the entire admission process. No change/modification is allowed. Please be careful in filling up the required information in all aspect.
- (c) Applicant shall now log on to using “registered email-id” and created “password” to fill the online registration form.
- (d) Applicant shall click the “Save” and proceed to check the details filled in the form.
- (e) The same login information is used every time to login to the applicant’s account.
- (f) Application shall upload the following (Wherever necessary):
- (i) Passport size photograph of the applicant (120x130) (only jpg & size upto 150KB)
 - (ii) Scanned signature of the applicant (200x50) (only jpg & size upto 100KB)
 - (iii) Self–attested copy of NEET-UG-2025 Admit Card(only PDF & Size upto 200KB)
 - (iv) Self–attested copy of NEET-UG-2025 Score Card(only PDF & Size upto 200KB)
 - (v) Self-attested copy of Aadhar Card (only PDF & Size upto 200KB)
 - (vi) Self-attested copy of Matriculation Certificate for verification of date of birth (only PDF & Size upto 200KB)
 - (vii) Self-attested copy of 11th and 10+2 Marksheet (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
 - (viii) Self-attested copy of 10+2 Certificate (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
 - (ix) A Certificate from the Principal of the School concerned on prescribed proforma available at faculty website: <https://fmsc.du.ac.in> stating that (i) the school is situated within National Capital Territory of Delhi, (ii) the school is recognized by the CBSE/Council for the Indian School Certificate/ Jamia Milia Islamia/Patrachar Vidyalaya/National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), (iii) the school is conducting regular classes, (except NIOS/Patracharya Vidyalaya) (iv) the applicant student has attended regular classes in the school for class (standard) 11th & 12th (except NIOS/Patrachar Vidyalaya) (only PDF & Size 200KB)
 - (x) The Applicants who have passed qualifying examination from Patrachar Vidyalaya or National Institute of Open Schooling will be eligible for admission in MBBS/BDS courses




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under 85% Delhi Quota provided their study center and the examination Center were within the National Capital Territory of Delhi (NCTD) and they must submit a certificate from the controlling authority of Patrachar Vidyalaya/NIOS in this regard(only PDF & Size200KB)

- (xi) Self-attested copy of Character Certificate in Performa as prescribed by CBSE, issued by the Principal of the school last attended or any Gazetted Officer (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xii) Self-attested copy of Scheduled Caste/ ScheduledTribe certificate as described in Section – B, clause 1A, if applicable (only PDF & Size upto 200KB)
- (xiii) Self-attested copy of Person with Disability (PwBd) certificate, if applicable (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xiv) Entitlement Certificate for C.W. category as described in Section –B Clause E, if applicable (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xv) Self-attested copy of OBC Certificate as described in Section–B clause B, if applicable (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xvi) Self-attested copy of the Non-Creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2025-2026, issued on or after 1.04.2025 and OBC caste certificate as per the Central list for OBC's (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xvii) Self-attested copy of the EWS certificate as described in section B Clause D(only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xviii) Self-attested copy of Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card, if applicable (only PDF & size upto 200KB)
- (xix) Allotment Letter issued by Medical Counseling Committee (MCC), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India.

Note: The applicants are required to bring Print out of Registration Form, Allotment letter alongwith original certificates (02 sets) of self-attested photocopies at the time of admission at the respective allotted college.

- (g) Once all the above – mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with “Make Payment”. Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using Back button before making payment. Once the payment is made, no changes can be made in the application form.
- (h) Applicant's application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fee.
- (i) In case a applicant wishes to apply in more than one Course then the applicant is required to submit total fee as prescribed for each course applied separately.

- (j) Please note that the candidature is subject to the applicant's fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study. **In case a applicant does not meet the minimum eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the applicant's own risk and cost and if at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto, and the fee paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.**

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The applicants are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

1.3 Online Registration Fee (Common for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota):

- (a) Online Registration Fee (Non-Refundable):-

- (b) Registration fee has to be paid during online registration process through one of the available online payment options.
- (c) It may be noted that the application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fee.
- D. The counseling for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota shall be done by MCC, DGHS Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The applicants are required to fulfill all the admission criteria, eligibility, merit and such criteria as may be prescribed for Registration for counselling as specified by MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in. Also, all the Rules & Regulations of MCC shall be followed in letter and spirit for admission to UG courses.


1. Course, College, Institutions, Number of seats and duration of Course:

- (a) The University of Delhi conducts MBBS Course in three Medical Colleges i.e. Lady Hardinge Medical College (LHMC), Maulana Azad Medical College (MAMC), University College of Medical Sciences (UCMS) and BDS Course at Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences(MAIDS).
- (b) Only female applicants are eligible for admission in LHMC.
- (c) Statement showing total number of seats in Under-Graduate (MBBS/BDS) Courses for the Session 2025-2026 is as follows:

** Actual sanction strength is 170. As per NMC letter No. 11021/339/2024-UGMEB dated 03.10.2024, 01 (seat) has been reduced from the UR (CW) Category. The NMC has been requested vide letter dated 27.11.2024 to reconsider its decision in the annual intake of UCMS for the Academic Year 2025-2026 i.e from 170-169 and provide 170 seats in the Academic Year 2025-2026 so that meritorious candidates from the NEET UG Examination should not be disadvantaged.







Note:

1. Seats may be added/deleted depending upon the status of approval from University/National Medical Commission/Dental Council of India/Ministry of Health & Family welfare (MOHFW) Government of India. However, in case of any increase in intake capacity in MBBS/BDS course (s) the same will be displayed before the start of the counseling session(s).
2. The applicants are advised to visit website <https://fmisc.du.ac.in> of Faculty of Medical Sciences and website www.mcc.nic.in of Medical Counseling Committee to see distribution of seats.

2. Duration of Courses:**MBBS Course:**

The normal duration of the course is 4½ years, followed by one year compulsory rotating Internship Training.

BDS Course:

The duration of the course is 4 years, followed by one year compulsory rotating Internship Training.

3. Eligibility Conditions/Requirement for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses

- (a) **Age:** The applicants should have completed the age of 17 (seventeen) years on or before 31st December 2025. The applicants completing the age of 17 years on 1st January 2025 or later on will not be eligible for admission, i.e., the applicant must be born on or before 31.12.2007.

(For details please refer to the Bulletin of Information to Undergraduate Medical Courses of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET – UG 2025)

(b) Qualifying examination:

- (i) The educational qualification for admission is as per NEET conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA). Further to become eligible for 85% Delhi Quota, the applicant must have passed 11th and 12th standard examination under 10+2 system conducted by CBSE/Indian school certificate examination/Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi or any other equivalent examination from a recognized school situated within the NCT of Delhi only. (see Appendix I)
- (ii) The Applicants who have passed qualifying examination from **Patrachar Vidyalaya or National Institute of Open Schooling** will be eligible for admission in MBBS/BDS courses under 85% Delhi Quota provided their study center and the examination Center were within the National Capital Territory of Delhi (NCTD) and they must upload a certificate from the controlling authority of Patrachar Vidyalaya/NIOS in this regard.

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NOTE: However, the candidature of applicants who have passed the qualifying examination i.e.10+2 from NIOS or state of open school or as private applicants from recognized state boards, or with Biology/Biotechnology as additional subject shall be allowed subject to the outcome of the special leave petitions/Appeals filed by National by National Medical Commission (NMC).

For details please refer to the Bulletin of Information for admission to Undergraduate Medical Courses of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (UG-2025)

- (iii) The applicants who do not qualify the NEET-UG 2025 Examination conducted by NTA are not eligible.
- (iv) Further, guidelines/eligibility conditions and other requirements will be decided by the Medical Sciences Course Admission Committee (MCAC) from time to time.
- (c) **Medical fitness:** The applicant should be medically fit for the course.

4. Nominee of Govt. of India (NGOI/Central Pool Scheme):

- (a) **Twenty One Seats (6-MAMC + 15-LHMC)** in MBBS Course will be filled up on the basis of recommendations of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi. These recommendations are made by the Ministry for the names sponsored by various authorities as given below. The eligible applicants should not apply for such seats to the Institutions/Colleges/ University or to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. **Such applicants for Central Pool Scheme should apply to following authorities only after obtaining the minimum marks in NEET-UG-2025.**

- (b) The applicants belonging to 'Central Pool Scheme' (NGOI) category for the Session 2025-2026 will be required to register online on or before the last date of admission.

Note : The College concerned may take necessary action pertaining to admission in the UG Courses (MBBS) under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW).

5. Procedure for selection to MBBS/BDS Courses shall be as follows :

The University of Delhi will not conduct a separate entrance examination for admission to MBBS/BDS courses under 85% Delhi Quota. Applicants are required to appear in NEET-UG 2025 conducted by NTA.

6. Display of merit list:

The counseling for admission to UG (MBBS/BDS) courses 2025 for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota will be undertaken by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. All applicants may regularly visit Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt. of India) website: www.mcc.nic.in for regular updates.

7. Procedure for admission, assignment of College/Institution:

- The applicant will be required to produce admission tickets of NEET-UG - 2025 and all original certificates including score card of NEET-UG-2025 at the time of admission to MBBS/BDS Course.
- The admission would be made strictly on merit on the basis of percentile of the eligible applicants in each category, determined by rank/ marks obtained in the NEET-UG-2025.
- As soon as a applicant is allotted his/her selected seat, they are required to register themselves online at <https://fmisc.du.ac.in> after verification of their documents from the respective college.

8. Counseling Schedule:-

The counseling for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota shall be done by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The applicants are required to fulfill

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all the modalities for registration for counselling as specified by MCC, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in.

9. Counseling procedure:-

- (i) The counseling will be done by Medical Counseling Committee, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt of India and the applicants are advised to visit website of MCC (www.mcc.nic.in) for all updates and procedure relating to counseling.
- (ii) The left over seats if provided by MCC will be filled up through Stray Vacancy Round as and when notified.

10. An undertaking is to be given by the applicant to the effect that they are not pursuing MBBS/BDS Courses anywhere in India. In case admitted/pursuing MBBS/BDS Courses anywhere in India they will be required to produce cancellation certificate from the concerned College/ Institution at the time of reporting/joining.

11. Resignation: Regarding resignation /withdrawal of seats by the applicants, the rules guidelines of MCC shall prevail in letter and spirit.

12. Surety Bond Money:-

A bond worth **Rs.3** lakhs with two sureties should be executed by the applicants at the time of their provisional admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Surety Bond is executed by the applicant. The Performa of Surety Bond is available on website: <https://fmssc.du.ac.in>.

Rules regarding payment of Surety Money:-

- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of MCC rules/instructions after joining the allotted institution.
- b. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
- c. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct /indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the students would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Surety Bond money, as the case may be. The **thirty percent** of the Bond Money thus collected will be deposited with the University (Faculty of Medical Sciences) by the institution and the rest could be utilized by the Institution for development of U.G teaching and training programmes.

Note : In case any student leaves the course by virtue of terms and conditions in the NMC/DCI Regulations and Ordinances of the University pertaining to Examination rules etc. then he/she will not be liable to pay the prescribed bond money.

13. Joining:

- a. The applicants, who have been admitted in a course, shall be required to join the assigned institution by stipulate date.
- b. The applicants must report to the college concerned by the date mentioned in their admission letter for completing the admission formalities at allotted college failing which his/ her admission is liable to be cancelled.
- c. As soon as a applicant is allotted his/her selected seat, he/she will be provisionally admitted in that course. College fee will be paid at college.

14. Migration:-

No Migration (to and fro) is permitted in the Medical College at the University of Delhi.

15. General instructions for the applicants:

(i) **The fee for online application for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) shall be applicable at par with Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe applicants. (EC Resolution No. 64(24) dated 23.06.2006).**


(ii) The Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity card fee. (vide DU circular no. Aca.1/082/2001/PwBD/2012-13/355 dated 13th September, 2012)

(iii) The candidature for the Under-graduate MBBS/BDS courses in University of Delhi is **strictly provisional** and mere appearance at the National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET-UG-2025), and registering online with www.mcc.nic.in/ Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) as well as in University of Delhi will not entitle the applicant for admission, which will be subjected to the marks/merit of NEET- UG-2025 and applicant's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. **Those applicants who are not eligible would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission. If at a later stage it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules, the registration and admission of such applicants will be invalid and no refund of fee will be done under any circumstances.**

Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course, he/she shall be liable to criminal prosecution; it will entail disqualification and shall render the applicant unfit for admission without any notice. The applicant shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the University.

(iv) The applicants shall have to comply with all the instructions while filling in the online registration form. Any error arising on this account shall be the responsibility of the applicants.

(v) Applicants, before filling in online registration form, should satisfy themselves of their eligibility for admission to the courses. The applicants are required to go through the BOI carefully and

acquaint themselves with all requirements with regard to the filling-in of the application form and admission process.

- (vi) This Bulletin of Information contains only brief extracts of the ordinances, rules and regulations of the University. The applicants should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University regarding eligibility requirements, payment of fee, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to their respective courses.
- (vii) The applicant should seek the information with regard to the hostel and other facilities from the college concerned.
- (viii) The various terms & conditions mentioned in the Bulletin of Information are subject to changes made in the Ordinances, Rules and Regulations by the University from time to time as per the decision of the University/National Medical Commission. The University reserves the right to amend the rules at its discretion as and when considered necessary.
- (ix) In case applicants furnished false information or document(s) etc. or are found to have withheld or concealed any material information while submitting their application, their candidature/result/ admission will be cancelled and fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
- (x) **The medium of teaching and examination for MBBS and BDS courses shall be English.**
- (xi) No TA/DA is admissible for appearing in the Admission/Counseling.
- (xii) Admission shall not be claimed by any applicant as a matter of right. The admission shall be entirely at the discretion of the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India and Medical Courses Admission Committee for UG (MBBS/BDS) of the University, which may refuse to admit any applicant without assigning any reason thereof.
- (xiii) In case of any dispute, the decision of the Medical Courses Admission Committee for UG (MBBS/BDS) shall be final. However, an appeal may be filed with the Vice- Chancellor, University of Delhi against such decision.
- (xiv) **For all legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.**
- (xv) The applicants must register themselves for online Counselling by the stipulated date and time as per the Counselling Schedule notified by the MCC (Government of India) on its website (www.mcc.nic.in /Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India)).
- (xvi) The applicants nominated by the Government of India (NGOI) having qualifications of a University/ Board which are not recognized by the University, should submit an equivalence certificate from the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). The admission of these students shall be subject to recognition of their qualifications by the University. The list of foreign qualifications recognized by the University equivalent to 12th class examination under 10+2 system is contained in Appendix-I.

16. Span Period

The span period including internship to complete MBBS Course will be as per the provision of MBBS Ordinance 2019 of the University :

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Clause 7.1: Every very learner shall undergo a period of certified study extending over 4½ acaemic years, divided into nine semesters from the date of commencement of course to the date of completion of examination which shall be followed by one year of compulsory rotating internship.

Clause 7.7 : No more than four attempts shall be allowed for a applicant to pass the first Professional examination. The total period for successful completion of first Professional course shall not exceed four (4) years. Partial attendance of examination in any subject shall be counted as an attempt.

Clause 11.2.6 : A learner shall not be entitled to graduate after 10 years of his /her joining of the first part of the MBBS Course.

BDS Span Period

EC Resolution No. 18-1-16 dated 18.08.2022

As per DCI Revised BDS (Course) 7th Amendment 2015 notified in official gazette on 23.05.2015.

“Any student who does not clear the BDS Course in all the subjects within a period of 09 years, including one year Compulsory Rotatory paid internship from the date of admission shall be discharged from the Course.”

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1. Reservations:-

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Note: 1. The students belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parents income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/ Fee exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & office letter no. Ref. No. Spl.Cell/2000.

Note: 2 Reference to University circular no. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 12.11.2015& letter no. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of Education. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible applicants facing financial constraint:-

- (i) No fee need to be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-metric Scholarship/Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission they may advised to deposit the fee with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the Centrally Funded Higher Education Institute (CFHEI) will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (iii) Special schemes under Schedule Case subplan /Tribal Subplan (SCSP/TSP) may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective Centrally Funded Higher Education Institute (CFHEIs) for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.

B. Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (Non-Creamy Layer, Central List):-

27% seats are reserved for applicants belonging to OBC category, while applying for admission to MBBS/BDS Course, should enclose a copy of the certificate alongwith the Application Form to the effect that he/she belongs to OBC Category duly certified by one of the competent authorities as listed below. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the **Central List of OBCs** notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes

consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University, the following provision has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X(4) of the said Ordinance:

1. Provided that the Persons with Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fee payable including the Examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing undergraduate, post-graduate or other Programmes in the University or its Colleges.
2. In pursuance of the above, the applicants with physical disabilities pursuing various Programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions / Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee.

3. PwBD applicants who will meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD applicant.
4. In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fee and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fee. The persons with Physical Disabilities shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee-in respect of the PwBD students is being met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwBD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.

It is clarified further that the PwBD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fee / charges / mess fee subject to the following conditions:

Up to Rs. 3000/- per month	Fee waiver + 50% Mess Subsidy

All Eligible SC/ST, PwBD students who are admitted to any college/Department should submit their scholarship form by February for processing.

D. Reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notification (Reference No. Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2019/63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2019/101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) Category, the University Departments/Centres/Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same in the Academic Year 2025-25. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications, and subject to submission of documents, issued by the Competent Authority, in the format provided in Appendix V.

1. Five percent (5%) seats are reserved on horizontal (compartmental) basis for the applicants belonging to CW Categories.
2. All the CW applicants have to upload the Educational Concession certificate in the enclosed format to be issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letterhead:-
 - (i) Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
 - (ii) Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board.
 - (iii) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
 - (iv) 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate
 - (v) Ministry of Home Affairs (for Police personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards).
3. Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Officer and Men of the Armed Forces including Para-Military Personnel* (C.W.) in the following order of preference:-

Priorities to be modified as per confirmation from MHA /Sainik Board.

Priority I	Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action;
Priority II	Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service;
Priority III	Widows/Wards of Defence Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service;
Priority IV	Wards of Defence Personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service;

The said conversion will be done only when the eligible Applicants belonging to the said Conversion Category have exhausted even after taking all steps by the counselling authority i.e. Medical Councelling Committee (MCC). Further, the unfilled seats of PwBD and CW sub category shall be reverted back to the respective category from which the seats have been allotted to these sub categories.

The format of Educational Concession Certificate (ECC) certificate is given at Appendix – K

Terms and conditions :

- The entitlement of the applicants for their claim under CW Category shall be considered as per Priorities claimed by them on the basis of the ECC issued by the concerned issuing authorities in the prescribed format of the Faculty of Medical Sciences, University of Delhi only. In case, the documents uploaded by the applicant at the time of registration does not support the claimed Priority in the ECC then the applicant will be declared as 'Not Eligible'
- The applicant for admission to UG Courses (MBBS/BDS) under CW Category will be required to upload all the relevant documents in prescribed format and size which is in legible form at

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the time of submission of their application. Further, the applicant will not be allowed for addition any new document after final submission of their application on the CW Portal and there would be no further communication allowed in any case. No Change or additional documents will be accepted after the documents have been uploaded on the online CW portal.

- (iii) The consolidated list of the registered candidates on the CW portal for entitlement under Delhi Quota (85%) shall be verified by the MCAC (UG) for their eligibility as per norms of the University of Delhi. The list of the candidates eligible for Delhi Quota (85%) shall be provided to the KSB, PMA Cell, MHA (for priority V (vii & x) and WARB, MHA (for the remaining Priorities Priority I to V only) alongwith the application forms and relevant documents for verification, as the case may be. The candidates who will not fulfill the eligibility criteria for Delhi Quota (85%) shall be excluded from the list with the remark "Outside Delhi candidate".
- (iv) The authorities of KSB, PMA Cell, and WARB, MHA will be responsible for addressing any grievances or litigations arising from the verification of CW/ECC certificates submitted by candidates through University of Delhi. The University of Delhi will not be held responsible for such issues.
- (v) The Issuing authority is responsible for the issuance of this certificate in accordance with the governing laws and regulations of the Ministry of Defence / Ministry of Home Affairs, as applicable.
- (vi) In the event of any issue/claim/dispute before the court of law in the matter of Priority assigned, the issuing authority shall defend the case, in the court of law and the University of Delhi shall be indemnified for such issue/claim/dispute.
- (vii) The provisional list of the eligible candidates for their entitlement under CW Category (Delhi Quota) duly verified by the KSB/MHA shall be forwarded to the MCC before the commencement of the Ist Round of counselling to conduct the counselling and to allot the seat on the basis of All India Rank, Category and Priority of the respective candidates for provisional admission subject to verification of the original documents by the concerned college at the time of reporting for admission by the selected candidate.

2. Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging: OrdinanceXVC:-

- (i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honor of women students;


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- (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (iv) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
 - (v) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suo moto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
 - (vi) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
 - (vii) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
 - (viii) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
 - (ix) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
 - (x) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
 - (xi) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
 - (xii) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
 - (xiii) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.



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- (xiv) The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

3. Sexual Harassment:-

Sexual Harassment (Ordinance XV-D) has repelled by the Act passed by Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (Ref. No. Estab.II(i)/27/ACC/2006 dated 09.01.2014. (www.wed.nic.in/wcdact/womenactsex.pdf).
